Objectives

2. To encourage the pursuit of post-secondary apprenticeship study.

Eligibility Criteria

Students must:

- Have a minimum grade 12 or equivalent diploma
- Be currently registered or plan to register in the 2010/2011 Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program (and must be continuing in the OYAP for a minimum of 1 year after high school) or;
- Be registered with the Ministry of Skills and Development and hired with an apprenticeship approved employer
- Be under the age of 21
- Resident of Milton

*Note that successful scholarship applicants will be required to provide proof of employment/registration before funds are released

Deadline for Application

- Applications must be received no later than **May 28, 2010**
