Day 1: Depart Toronto for Glasgow Airport.

Day 2: Arrive in Glasgow in the morning; picked up by our coach to our Glasgow hotel, the Premier Inn, Charing Cross. The balance of the day is free time to relax and adjust to the time change. There is a 15 minute walk to the pedestrian malls of Sauchiehall Street and the Buchanan Gallery. There are many pubs, restaurants and shops in these areas.

Day 3: Glasgow train station to Oban. Considered by many to be the most scenic rail journey in the world, the West Highland line leaves cities behind and delves deep into the wild west coast going through the Loch Lomond and Trossachs National Park. You will travel through a daunting landscape of mountains, steep sided lochs and heather moors. Watch out for red deer outlined on a skyline or half hidden in the heather. Overnight at the Perle Oban Hotel, a Victorian hotel on the Oban harbour front - a 200 yard walk from the train station. Oban offers an intriguing variety of local and national stores for shopping. The Oban Distillery, established in 1794 is a short walk from the hotel if you wish, to taste their version of the "Water of Life".

Day 4: Our trip continues from Oban to Pitlochry by our bus. Pitlochry is situated in the heart of the stunning scenery of Highland Perthshire. Pitlochry today is a bustling tourist town and has been welcoming visitors for over 170 years. The name comes from Gaelic origins meaning, "Place of the Sentinel Stone". Pitlochry is justifiably proud of its Victorian heritage, offering visitors much to enjoy. It is the ideal holiday destination for those who love Scotland's hills and heritage. Our base accommodation for the next four nights will be the Atholl PalaceHotel. Its central position and easy accessibility makes it a perfect touring base for visiting Scotland's other delights in every season.

Day 5: Trip to the Cairngorm National Park. Cairngorm National Park is the largest National Park in the UK with the widest variety of traditional and unique villages. This park is your gateway to Aviemore and the Cairngorms, Angus Glens, Atholl and Glenshee, Tomintoul and Glenlivet as well as Royal Deeside and the donside area. A tour of the park and a ride to the top of the mountain on the vehicular railway. From the top of the mountain, you have a view of 50 miles in every direction

to witness the beauty, ruggedness and charm of this corner of the $\mbox{\sc Highlands}.$

Day 6: Day trip to Inverness, Culloden and its battlefield museum and Clava. As well as being the home of the renowned Loch Ness monster, Inverness offers beautiful scenery, walks along the Ness River, a bustling city and many tourist activities. A trip from Loch Ness to Urquhart Castle drawing in the mottled green fields and beautiful hills surrounding the Loch make for beautiful pictures for memories of this trip. Culloden is the scene of one of the pivotal battles for Scotland centuries ago. The Battlefield Museum has done an excellent job of revealing the politics, the clans and the warriors of this battle. Definitely a must see. The Clava Cairn is a type of Bronze age circula named after the group of three cairns at Balnua, Inverness. There are about 50 cairn round stones about Inverness. Our day includes a stop at the Dalwhinnie distillery, which was opened in 1897 and was originally named Strathspey. This is one of Scotland's best known whiskeys.

Day 7: Half day free time in Pitlochry. Walk among the buildings, visit the shops and wonder about beautiful jewelry made from heather. Heathergems are handcrafted from the stems of the Scottish heather plant. You may want a bite of lunch and a pint at a local pub ahead of an afternoon bus trip before returning to Atholl Palace Hotel.

Day 8: Return to Glasgow. We return to Glasgow by way of historic Stirling, former capital of ancient Scotland. Stirling Castle overlooks a city of beautiful architecture, friendly people and a history going back centuries. We will also be stopping and the unique Falkirk Wheel on the way back to our Glasgow hotel, the Premier Inn. Charing Cross.

Day 9: Free day in Glasgow. Optional tours and ideas to be offered such as the ocean paddle steamer "the Waverley", the last operating ocean going paddle steamer in the world. They operate a number of tours mostly in the Clyde Estuary out to the Inner Islands.

Day 10: Return to Canada. This will be a daytime flight back to Toronto arriving sometime in the afternoon.

Plan now to join the Milton Chamber group for this once in a lifetime Scotland Adventure. Space is limited.
